MEETING OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Communicate about the project and potential complete streets solutions
- 2. Provide input on preliminary concepts

The following notes summarize the participants' opinions and questions of the potential complete streets solutions and preliminary conceptual plans, and SSFM team's corresponding answers.

Liliha Street

Preliminary Concepts (SSFM team presented)

- 1. Implement road diet, transitioning street from four to three vehicle lanes consisting of two through lanes and a center, two-way left-turn lane. The reduction of lane allows space within the roadway cross section to be reallocated for a bike lane on the uphill side, and 5' more space for widening sidewalks. The downhill travel lane will be a shared lane for cars and bikes with sharrow.
- 2. Off-set road to maintain on-street parking.
- 3. Add curb extensions to shorten crossing distances at intersections and mid-block locations.
- 4. Plant trees in curb extensions and along sidewalks where space allows to add shade and greenery.
- 5. Liliha at Kuakini: Designated left turn lane from Kuakini onto Liliha. This transition would not affect capacity, just would define the intersection better and make it easier for people to navigate.



Nuuanu Avenue

Preliminary Concepts (SSFM team presented):

- 1. Reconfigure vehicular traffic into a three-lane cross section with one lane going Mauka and two lanes going Makai (Kuakini to School) and one lane each direction with center turn lane (Judd to Wyllie).
- 2. The freed-up space from removing one lane can be used to add a 5' climbing bike lane and sidewalk extension.
- 3. Parking spots will be retained on Ewa side of the road from School St to Kuakini St except during peak hour (like current condition)
- 4. Crosswalks less than 300 feet apart are not compliant with the Complete Streets manual, and some will be considerate.
- 5. There are two alternatives for Nuuanu Ave, one adds roundabouts at Nuuanu/Judd, Nuuanu/Pauoa, and Nuuanu/Wyllie (Alternative 1), and the other keeps these as signalized intersections, as they are today (Alternative 2), with some intersection improvements.

Map Exercise:

Participants reviewed large maps showing preliminary concepts for Liliha St and Nuuanu Ave. Participants recorded their comments and suggestions on the map. The comments are summarized below:
