

CREATING A SENSE OF PLACE USING MURALS



1 COMMIT TO PROJECT

Depending on size, location, and extent, murals can take 6 to 12 months and cost \$1,000 to \$10,000. After installation, the applicant must maintain the artwork.



2 APPROVAL OF LOCATION

Existing curb extensions and electrical boxes are excellent locations. Other areas may be eligible. Contact the Complete Streets Program to get approval of location and to determine if traffic control and a street usage permit is necessary.



3 DESIGN & MATERIALS

To bring a sense of place, propose a design significant to the community. Words and offensive images are not permitted. Only pre-approved materials can be used. Present your design to your neighborhood board and community. Prior to installation, the design and materials must be approved by the Complete Streets Program and then the Commission on Culture and Arts.

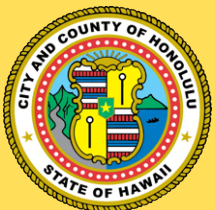


4 INSTALLATION DATE & PREPARE

If necessary, apply for a Street Usage Permit to utilize the public space for the date selected. Invite community members to participate with the installation.

5 INSTALL

Ensure any necessary traffic controls are in place, prepare surface, layout design, and have fun painting!
