

McCully SHARED STREETS

A Pilot Project

The City and County of Honolulu is piloting Shared Streets on Waiola Street, Hau'oli Street, and Pumehana Street to support safe and comfortable walking and biking. The project aims to create connections to key destinations in and around the McCully neighborhood.

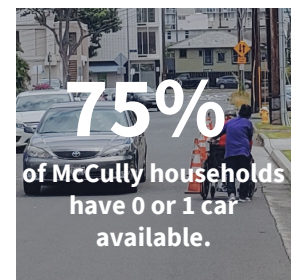
Shared Streets open the roadway to all by slowing driving speeds and discouraging cut-through traffic using cones and signs. When using Shared Streets, expect people using the entire roadway to walk or bike. Motorists should drive at walking speed when people are on the street. Share the road, and travel with aloha for all road users.

The temporary pilot project on Waiola and Hau'oli Streets will last for approximately 60 days starting May 1, 2021, and **Pumehana Street for 14 days starting June 16, 2021.** The project will end on June 30, 2021. Parking will not be affected. Permanent pedestrian and bicycle improvements will depend on community feedback. Please share your experience with McCully Shared Streets!
