

Public and stakeholder engagement was critical in shaping the development of the Oahu Pedestrian Plan (Plan). As part of a robust engagement process, a plan-specific Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) was created to bring together key stakeholders to inform the Plan's development. The TAC provided input and guidance on the Plan through four meetings and advanced review of Plan materials. The TAC was complimented by parallel engagement with the City's existing Complete Street Core Team (CSCT), and jointly the two groups provided input from critical stakeholders.
