

Off and Running

The City's Department of Parks and Recreation proudly opened its ninth off-leash dog park at Hoa Aloha Neighborhood Park in Salt Lake last month, marking another significant stride in promoting a pet-friendly community.

Built in partnership with Councilmember Radiant Cordero of the Honolulu City Council, the dog park includes water fountains, benches and two separate fenced-in areas for large and small dogs. The dog parks encompass 10,000 square feet, with 7,000 sq. ft. for large dogs and 3,000 sq. ft. for little pooches.

The City's dedication to pet-friendly initiatives extends beyond mere convenience, emphasizing the numerous benefits of outdoor recreation for both dogs and their owners. The addition of this new park not only enhances the City's reputation as an inviting and pet-inclusive place, but also underscores its ongoing effort to create vibrant public spaces that cater to the diverse needs of its residents.

The City and County of Honolulu received the 2023 Project of the Year award from the Project Management Institute (PMI) Hawai'i for their work on a major upgrade of the CGI Advantage ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) system, also known as C2HERPS.
