





PROJECT SUMMARY:

The design was done prior to the City's Stormwater BMP Manual for New and Redevelopment dated July 2014 and the new MS4 permit. However, the project included post construction source control and treatment control bmps. A new fuel canopy was constructed as source control to prevent stormwater from coming into contact with fueling operations. Treatment control consisted of 250 lineal feet of grassed infiltration areas downstream of parking areas and supplemented with grated inlet filters. For small storm events runoff from pavements and associated pollutants are retained and infiltrated in the grassed infiltration areas. Rain falling on a portion of the roof is retained and infiltrated in the infiltration trench and grassed infiltration areas fronting the main building.



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
